"able to identify the relevant legal, ethical, and cultural frameworks that appertain to a patient's situation, to consider them when making decisions, and to adapt plans in the light of these factors."

Regularly and routinely raises and discusses legal and ethical aspects on a patient's care with team membes

Works within the major legal frameworks appertaining to their clinical practice. (e.g. Mental Capacity Act)

Ensures that the legally-defined rights of and duties owed to people with disability are respected especially by others.

Identifies when ethical aspects of a situation are important, and discusses them

Establishes the patient's personal cultural context, and adapts all decsions and actions accordingly

Discusses the potential wider social and ethical cosequences and implications of decisions, outside direct patient considerations
